Thank you for your letter concerning the teachers' salary case. I am enclosing copy of the opinion in the latest teachers' salary case - Mills v. Maryland State Board of Education. This case is reported in the Federal Supplement but I do not have the situation at present. The opinion was decided on March 1, 1939. Although this case is a Federal one seeking an injunction against the State Board of Education, it is clanguage can be very easily used in our case, e.g., see pages 15-16 of the opinion, and especially the section on page 16 giving a teacher a status to raise the constitutional question. See page 22 where we have the first judicial statement authorizing the petition for sendanus to equalize teachers' salaries. I would suggest that you go over this entire opinion and it might be wise to use it in an additional brief to be considered with out present brief.
