Dear Thurgood:

Your letter of the 22nd ult., is before me, in regards to taking the Teachers' Salary cases to the U.S. Supreme Court. I did not answer earlier because I wanted to discuss this matter with my Teachers' Committee, particularly its Chairmen. They express the determination that this case go on. That means we want a decision by the U.S. Supreme Court upon the record as made by the courts of this state.

The court entered its order denying my petition for rehearing on the 13th day of Sept. 1939. Under the rule we have ninety (90) days from that date to file petition in the U.S. Supreme Court. The record is small and there is nothing new to be added to the briefs, in our office file.
